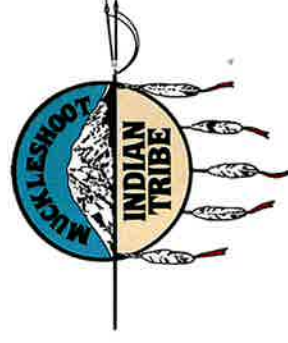

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be an enrolled Muckleshoot Tribal member or a biological descendant.
- Must be between the ages of 14-18 years of age.
- Must be enrolled in school throughout the time of participation.



Application Process:

- CCEOP will advertise openings, 30 for the school year session and 40 for summer session.
- Each participant must submit a completed application online via. QR Code.
- If students need help with completing the online application, The CCEOP Youth crew supervisors will be available Mon.-Fri. 8 AM - 5 PM to provide assistance with completing the online application.
- Participants will be hired on a first come first serve basis.
- participants must re-apply for each session.



Hiring Process:

- Each applicant will be interviewed.
- Youth Crew Supervisors will contact the applicants that that have been selected for hire.
- Applicants must attend Orientation upon hire.
- Applicants will be required to take a UA drug screen.
- Applicant must provide a copy of their Tribal ID, Social Security Card, and a signed program documents.
